

DID YOU KNOW?

- On average, every 31 minutes a person is killed in an alcohol-related traffic crash (NHTSA, 2005a).
- 39% of fatal traffic crashes were alcohol-related in 2004 (NHTSA, 2005b).
- 76% of fatal traffic crashes occurring between midnight and 3 AM were alcohol-related (NHTSA, 2005b).
- There are over 300 alcohol-poisoning deaths each year in the United States (Yoon et al., 2003).

Alcohol is involved in up to:

- **76%** of rapes (Brecklin & Ullman, 2001)
- **66%** of violent incidents between intimate partners (Greenfeld & Henneberg, 2001)
- **30-70%** of drownings (Driscoll et al., 2004)
- **50%** of homicides (Martin, 2001)
- **50%** of assaults (Martin, 2001)
- **38%** of suicides (Bennett & Collins, 2000; Smith et al., 1999).
- **39%** of fatal traffic crashes (NHTSA, 2005a)
