Dear Mr. Farnham:

This is in reference to my recent discussions with Mrs. Wiggins on my credit status. There appears to have been some error in regard to notification of delayed payment from Schmitt Music Company and I appreciate that this has been expunged.

I believe you will find that in 1967 an error on your part also occurred in which a loan I repayed early was coded as a delinquent loan. This came very close to causing my loss of the house I was negotiating to purchase.

I am perhaps not perfect in credit matters but have a 21 year history of always meeting my obligations in this community. I hold a responsible post as a department head at the University, and have a combined income varying from \$45-55,000, etc.

I suppose that any serious further reflection on my credit status, or major loss or embarrassment thereupon, due to demonstrable errors on the part of your firm will have to result in some protective actions on my part.

Of course, any problem I bring on myself I will expect to be reported faithfully. I am happy for the opportunity of the recent helpful interview with Mrs. Wiggins.
