Geoff. Rose computes for each CHD risk factor a "Community Risk" from what he calls "attributable risk" times prevalence. Can you help me understand what he does precisely?

<u>Risk Factor</u>	<u>Attributable Risk</u>	<u>Community Risk</u>	<u>Location or Risk</u>
SBP	51	58	<170
UA	26	68	< 6
RBW	24	64	< 15
CHOL.	18	70	<280
CIG.	18	64	≥ 20
B. SUGAR	11	72	<120

Two thirds of community risk occurs at levels below "clinical attention" (norms) thus mass control requires mass measures.
