Dear Cam:

I consider Harry Ungerleider to be one of the remarkable individuals of U. S. medicine, and believe that his ideas have been important and influential. It is my intention to try to arrange some formal honor of Harry within the next couple of years. It is not quite clear to me yet what the most appropriate form should be.

I have thought of a purely social H. U. day at a national meeting of insurance people or a professional H. U. conference on insurance medicine and internal medicine, along the lines of the Minnesota Heart Conference I arranged for Ernst Simonson.

Have you any ideas? Do you feel Harry was close to and active enough in AHA that it might take a part? Would any of the AHA lectureships be appropriate? Would the Council on Clinical Cardiology have any interest in co-sponsoring a conference?

I imagine that it would be best to pursue this through insurance medical channels, but just want to see first if you have any positive feelings about it. The idea should remain confidential.
