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Dear Nakl:

Your point on ST-T changes in bundle branch block is a good one. I am thinking about it and trying to look at it on the basis of theory, and on the basis of systematic clinical observations. I shall also correspond with Lepeschkin who has used a mechanical aid for some years in which heart rate and QRS duration are taken into account in assessing whether the T wave findings are "pathological."

Meanwhile, I prefer to leave this out of the Minnesota Code but anyone is, of course, free to code T waves in the presence of RBBB or anything else for that matter, for his own purposes.

I have also cleaned up the definitions of axes, etc. a bit and will send them promptly.
