Dear Henry:

I am enclosing the tentative schedule which we discussed on the phone for a monthly block of committee meetings for C.P.P. as an alternative to the present uncoordinated selections of time and place. I have made a list of those individuals who sit on more than one committee and find that the conflicts would be remarkably few. Robert Benfari was listed as a member of the Design and Analysis Committee, but I have just called him and he tells me that Jim Dalen has now taken over that spot. The only remaining conflicts are those of Rick Shekelle and Marilyn Farrand. I called Rick and he generously agreed to forego attending the Design and Analysis Committee in the general interest if this scheme is adopted. I was unable to reach Marilyn Farrand, who is out of town until next Monday. also talked to Chuck Kaelber who was favorably disposed towards the idea even though it would interfere with his ability to attend all the meetings which he has been trying to do up to now. He feels that he could make the necessary alternative arrangements for the required NHLI representation.

The scheme would apply equally well to any location although Chicago probably minimizes expense and inconvenience. If we start and finish a little later each day, most of us can reach Chicago on the morning of our first meeting, and would be able to return on the last evening at a reasonable time.
