- 1) Provalence cases of infarct and angina in the railroad are being reviewed again to be ready this week.
- 2) Incidence cases of infarct and angina, based on clinical confirmation are now identified in these classes, and the data are enclosed including first examination date and date of event.
 - a) Documented infarct
 - b) Undocumented inferct
 - c) Possible infarct
 - d) Definite angina
 - e) Possible angina
- 3) ECG prevalence cases are available on punch cards, and should include those criteria only.
 - a) I. I
 - b) 1.2 or 3 plus V or 2
- 4) ECG incidence data are coded in duplicate and 1/3 of the disagreements adjudicated. They will be complete by April 15th.
- 5) You will receive a memo on the "normal cardiovascular cohort" and the "normal respiratory cohort" in which the criteria of my 7/10/64 memo are maintained. I have not considered a "non-coronary" cohort alone as appropriate. (i.e. should strokes and rheumatic heart disease, etc. be followed in the non-coronary cohort?)
