There aren't any funds set aside for this but, of course, I would arrange to pay transportation and "minimum scale," whatever that might be in Moscow.

If you can give me any leads that I can pursue directly or if you would be willing to serve as agent interlocutor, I would be most grateful. From my brief visit there a few years back, I got the impression that Leningrad is the closet place to find any solid musicians.

I need at least a trombone and rhythm section (I'll play lead on soprano). However, any conventional arrangement would be fine, if there is a group which doesn't like to be broken up. It would have to be a group predominately traditional in orientation.
