Dear Henry:

I am most grateful for your fine spirit and I am happy to gleam from your letter that you feel your trip to Cuba was worthwhile.

Regarding the visit of Henry Jr., I still feel that it can be very helpful. It seems to me that you suggested that he spend a month. I am a little puzzled about expenses, since we can offer him room and board but not travel expenses.

The following is my idea for his contribution. He would spend most of his time between my clinic and the one in Mayari, although he would visit the one at Omaja, and his activities would be divided in this way:

- 1. Help me work out a public health program according to our needs and what what would appear to be acceptable to our doctors in consultation with them.
- 2. Visits in home of the out patients.
- 3. A study of our typical tropical deseases with the point of view of improving our standard of treatments.
- 4. From his experience, advices as to improvements in routine treatments according to our resources.
- 5. Take over direction, for say two weeks, of the clinic to allow some of us a breathing spell.
