Dear Roy,

I am very grateful for your remarks and was also badly put off by the Editorial comment of Medical Opinion: 1) because I had so carefully prepared the issue and assembled the articles; 2) because I share an acute sensitivity about the excessive association of my name with MRFIT; 3) because the Editorial comment and labeling of me as "MR.FIT" was a total surprise, unexpected, and unwelcome. You will note if you refer carefully again to my cover letter that I had included a mild apology for the labeling as "MR.FIT" which was beyond my control. You will note that the articles themselves stringently avoid my identification with MRFIT.

Though I say I am grateful for your comments, I believe that if your feeling is shared by others, and that this misidentification has occurred twice in a year through my naive or insufficient dealings with the press, that my official identification with MRFIT should be ended to avoid further embarrassment or other issues that you mention. I am taking steps immediately with Oley Paul to remove myself from this identification. I would have done so in the next month at any rate, so you need to feel no concern that you personally are responsible for my resignation.
