Our daughter Martha, aged 31, an accomplished devotee of the arts and a semi-vegetarian, has been asking about a book on nutrition to help her sort out the truth from the garbage. Searching in our home library I came upon your book with Margaret McWilliams. I confess that I did not go through the book with care when it came out in 1973 but now that I look at it with Martha in mind I find it sound, well balanced, and probably the best in the field. I was impressed with Chapter 2 which I had not read before.

I note that you were more equivocal about the diet and cholesterol than you might be today. Still, all the answers on total and HDL cholesterol are not in, as you will see in my Lancet paper of last year, copy enclosed. I also enclose my latest. A third paper will show that the serum cholesterol and mortality story gets complicated when we get to old age.

Last month we enjoyed a 3-day international symposium in my honor at Anacapri a few hundred yards from where Paul White wrote the ms. for the first edition of his book on heart disease.
