Of course I am happy with your documentation of the Eskimo story. Pehaps you know of my reference to the Eskimo in JAMA volume 124, 1912-1919, August 1957. Alas! I have seen the nonsense about the Eskimo repeated many times during the intervening years. I mentioned the Eskimo story in my review, "Coronary Heart Disease -- The Global Picture," 1975, ATHEROSCLEROSIS 22: 149-192. Essentially the same major review was published in Italian in Volume II of Cardiologia D'Oggi (C.G. Ediziono Medico Scientifiche, Torino) and an up-dated version is now in press in a new edition of Cardiologia D'Oggi.

I am interested to learn that you now have in press a monograph on the dietary habits of native populations of the Northwest Territories. It would be useful if, eventually, we could have a copy at Minnelea where Dr. Stamler, Dr. Martti J. Karvonen (who has moved from Finland to live next door) and I are assembling a working library on diet, epidemiology, etc.

I shall return to our Italian home early in May to stay until midsummer and Dr. Stamler will be at his home there for most of June until late August.
