
Thank you for advising me of your support for impeachment of the President. That is the way I expect to vote.

The President's statement of August 5, condensed to one sentence, is that he misled his staff, his counsel, and those who argued his case. Of course, he has also misled the American people. He was involved in the cover-up from the beginning.
