I received the tentative program for the Henry L. Taylor Colloquium to be held either before or after the spring ACSM meeting. My immediate reaction is that a Saturday afternoon affair following the ACSM meeting would be fine. I certainly would be happy to present a paper on $\dot{V}O_2$ max that reviews our early efforts in this area with amplification from more recent results. I would also be happy to participate as a discussant on one of the aspects of the prevention of coronary heart disease because of the involvement of Penn State in the first collaborative exercise study and our 12-year follow-up of that study that is currently underway.

Nevertheless, I realize that time is limited and that your program looks like you are striving for only one appearance by each of those who have been close to Henry.

The dinner on Saturday evening sounds great.

A further publication possibility is that Al Fishman, the new editor at JAP, has rather unilaterally decided that the proceedings of special symposia could be published in the JAP. If the tentative MSIS plan falls through, you might contact Fishman. Henry was an early contributor to the JAP and Ernst Simonson was instrumental in getting the JAP started. As an associate editor of the JAP, I would be willing to handle the shepherding of the manuscripts through the review process.
