I will also discuss it with Jack Miller when I am next in Dallas. Unfortunately, the decision to go with Arthur Ashe as the National Chairman of the fund raising effort is now a fate acompli and I suspect that we need to capitalize on the fact that he had a heart attack, bypass surgery, and that his major risk factor appears to have been a very bad family history. Perhaps the spots should be changed to indicate that other risk factors such as family history are important, at the same time that we avoid the pitfall of suggesting the people should adopt a fatalistic attitude, At any rate, I shall followup on this matter with Mr. Miller and be in touch with you.
