Please forgive my delay in response to your interesting letter and challenge.

Enclosed are rather poor efforts on history of the Lab and the Division. It certainly hasn't been done in a systematic, complete or scholarly way.

I think your list of correspondents is most appropriate. You perhaps weren't aware that Joe Anderson died several years ago. The others you mention are hale and hardy as far as I know. It sounds as if you'll have a good time with this.

It looks as if a "final solution" to Memorial Stadium will probably be reached before too long. It is falling down around us despite a very attractively remodeled section at Gate 20 that we had built in 1982. This means that we'll probably be relocated to an off-campus space for X number of years until, we hope, we will have contiguous space on campus. Our present occupancy is 80,000 square feet in six locations, so it's not very likely that in our time we will all be together, or contiguous with the School of Public Health. But we are beginning to make some inroads into the long process that leads to the Regent's agenda and finally to the Legislative agenda.

I encourage you to contact Ancel promptly. He had a near fatal pneumonia in December and has had two very serious transient ischemic attacks, one in November and one in February.
