Dear Flaminio:

12 bottles of ECG paste left here this week, enough for both areas. The medical history form in Italian you now have is fine, as I detailed in my last letter. The physical exam-form is being typed today and you will receive it within a week. It is a little easier to code than the one used in Finland but contains the same information and I would like for you to wait for it.

I'm most disappointed about Menotti. I can't understand why we don't get the proper support from Puddu. I had looked forward to a worthwhile relationship with Menotti on a longterm basis and I hope you will do something positive to encourage it. He will, in time, profit considerably from participation in our work. I think it's up to you, principally, and Ancel and myself, to make it sufficiently attractive to him.

In regards to his training of inexperienced examiners I would insist on seeing this month some concrete evidence of it in the form of some studies on their results with Rose questionnaires and blood pressures.
